THE SENATE SCHOOL OF TRUST HEARING CONCERNS OF THE TERRITORIES

HANDICAP LAW NEED TO BE IMPROVED

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USPA NEWS - School of trust has voted at the Senate hears the concerns of the territories. The Senate adopted, on Tuesday, May 21, 2019, 213 votes in favor, a deeply amended version of the bill for a school of trust, responding to the legitimate concerns expressed by local communities in recent weeks. The Senate has retained the main provision of the text - the reduction to three years of mandatory education, voted unanimously - as well as measures to strengthen the control of family education and reform of training initial teacher.

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The committee text has been enriched by the adoption of 60 amendments from all sides of the hemicycle. In particular, the Senate held:

to significantly improve the disability aspect of the bill;

to include in the code of education the training of future teachers in the mastery of digital tools and resources, their pedagogical use as well as the knowledge and understanding of issues related to the digital ecosystem and training students in environmental education and sustainable development from primary school.
